# On-going projects in the context of the EC Communication 'Setting out the EU approach to Standard Essential Patents' (COM (2017) 712 final)

## **1. Open Source Software and Standardisation:**

*'The Commission will work with stakeholders, open source communities and SDOs for successful interaction between open source and standardisation, by means of studies and analysis.'*  
(Final report autumn 2019).

## **2. Essentiality checks for SEPs:**

*'The Commission ... will launch a pilot project for SEPs in selected technologies with a view to facilitate the introduction of an appropriate scrutiny mechanism.'* (Final report spring 2020).

  - **Interplay of intellectual property right systems and SDOs**
  - **Public policy perspective (beyond member interests, including consumer-, end-user-, vertical industry interests, transparency)**
- ❑ Role of the European Commission?

# SDO Governance Issues (1)

## Standardisation ecosystem:

- SDOs exposure to geo political tensions?
- Competition vs. collaboration of SDOs?
- Options for standardisation contributors: pick and choose SDO, walk away from SDOs, choose another SDO or found a new one, return options?
- Lock in with certain standards?
- Relevance of IP policies in this context?

## Governance architecture:

- Relevance/effectiveness of appeal procedures?
- Different levels of membership?
- Role of mediation/ADR?
- Who should decide what (General assembly vs. working groups vs. special decision bodies)?
- Role of non-SEP holders in IPR related SDO processes?

# SDO Governance Issues (2)

## Governance principles:

- Classification of 'openness'?
- How to define 'public interest'?
- How much 'public interest' apart from members' interest? Who decides?
- Co-existence of technical and legal (IPR) issues in SDOs?
- 'Keep commercial issues outside of SDOs'. Possible?

## Governance and IPR policies:

- Role of SDOs with patent pool formation?
- IPR policy options for change considering consensus principle?
- Consideration of interests of new players (verticals) in IoT business environment?
- Role of baseline IPR policy?
- Can/should FRAND be further defined?
