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EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

In the current application an authorisation is sought under Article 4(1) for *L-tryptophan produced by fermentation with Escherichia coli* CGMCC 7.460, under the category/functional group 3 (c) 'nutritional additives'/'amino acids, their salts and analogues', according to Annex I of Regulation (EC) No 1831/2003. The authorisation is sought for all animal species.

According to the Applicant, the *feed additive* contains *L-tryptophan* with a minimum purity of 98 % (w/w). The *feed additive* is intended to be added directly to *compound feed* or through *premixtures*. The Applicant did not propose a minimum or maximum *L-tryptophan* content in *compound feed*.

For the determination of *tryptophan* in the *feed additive* and *premixtures* the Applicant proposed the ring-trial validated EN ISO 17180 method, however the scope of the proposed method does not include the target amino acid (*tryptophan*). Furthermore, the EURL is aware of another ring-trial validated EN ISO 13904 method based on high performance liquid chromatography with fluorescence detection (HPLC-FLD) which is specifically dedicated for the determination of free *tryptophan* in commercial products and *premixtures* (containing more than 2 % (w/w) of *tryptophan*) and for the determination of free and total *tryptophan* in *compound feed*.

For the determination of *tryptophan* in *compound feed* the Applicant submitted a ring-trial validated European Union (EU) method, applicable for the determination of the free (synthetic and natural) and total (peptide-bound and free) amino acid using an HPLC method with fluorescence detection (FLD). The method does not distinguish between the amino acid enantiomers.

Based on the performance characteristics available, the EURL recommends for official control the above mentioned two ring-trial validated methods based on HPLC-FLD to determine *tryptophan* in the *feed additive*, *premixtures* and/or *compound feed*.

In addition, for the identification of the *feed additive* the EURL recommends the "L-tryptophan monograph" of the Food Chemical Codex (FCC), where different tests including one based on optical rotation for enantiomer-specific identification are described.

Further testing or validation of the methods to be performed through the consortium of National Reference Laboratories as specified by Article 10 (Commission Regulation (EC) No 378/2005, as last amended by Regulation (EU) 2015/1761) is not considered necessary.

1. BACKGROUND

In the current application an authorisation is sought under Article 4(1) (authorisation of a new feed additive) for *L-tryptophan produced by fermentation with Escherichia coli* CGMCC 7.460, under the category/functional group 3(c) 'nutritional additives'/'amino acids, their salts and analogues', according to Annex I of Regulation (EC) No 1831/2003. The authorisation is sought for all animal species [1,2]. *L-tryptophan* (produced by *Escherichia coli*) is already authorised as *feed additive* under several Commission Implementing Regulations [3-5].

According to the Applicant, the *feed additive* contains *L-tryptophan* with a minimum purity of 98 % (w/w) [6]. The *feed additive* is produced by fermentation with a strain of *Escherichia coli* CGMCC 7.460 [7].

The *feed additive* is intended to be added directly to *compound feed* or through *premixtures* [8]. However, the Applicant did not propose a minimum or maximum *L-tryptophan* content in *compound feed* [2,8].

Note: The EURL has previously evaluated the analytical methods in the frame of several *L-tryptophan* related dossiers [9].

2. TERMS OF REFERENCE

In accordance with Article 5 of Regulation (EC) No 378/2005, as last amended by Regulation (EU) 2015/1761, on detailed rules for the implementation of Regulation (EC) No 1831/2003 of the European Parliament and of the Council as regards the duties and the tasks of the European Union Reference Laboratory concerning applications for authorisations of feed additives, the EURL is requested to submit a full evaluation report to the European Food Safety Authority for each application or group of applications. For this particular dossier, the methods of analysis submitted in connection with *L-tryptophan produced by fermentation with Escherichia coli* CGMCC 7.460 and their suitability to be used for official controls in the frame of the authorisation were evaluated.

3. EVALUATION

Description of the analytical methods for the determination of the active substance in the feed additive, premixtures, feedingstuffs and when appropriate water (section 2.6.1 of the dossier - Annex II of Commission Regulation (EC) No 429/2008)

For the determination of *tryptophan* in the *feed additive* and *premixtures* the Applicant proposed the ring-trial validated EN ISO 17180 method based on high performance liquid chromatography with fluorescence detection [10], however the target amino acid (*tryptophan*) is not included in the scope of the proposed method [11].



Furthermore, the EURL is aware of another ring-trial validated EN ISO 13904 method based on high performance liquid chromatography with fluorescence detection (HPLC-FLD) [12] which is specifically dedicated for the determination of free *tryptophan* in commercial products and *premixtures* (containing more than 2 % (w/w) of *tryptophan*) and for the determination of free and total *tryptophan* in *compound feed* [12].

The sample of the *feed additive* and *premixtures* (0.5 to 5.0 g) is mixed with 0.1 M hydrochloric acid and stirred for 30 min. After letting particles to settle down, an aliquot is taken, mixed with an internal standard (alpha-methyltryptophan) and diluted with 0.1 M hydrochloric acid. The mixture is then filtered for further chromatographic analysis by HPLC with fluorescence detection (excitation and emission wavelengths at 280 nm and 356 nm, respectively). The quantification of *tryptophan* is performed via an internal standard calibration [12].

For the determination of *tryptophan* in *compound feed* the Applicant proposed [10] a ring-trial validated European Union (EU) method [13], where the procedure to determine *tryptophan* in *compound feed* is identical to the one described in the above mentioned EN ISO 13904 method [12]. The EU method is applicable for the determination of free (synthetic and natural) and total (peptide-bound and free) amino acid using an HPLC with fluorescence detection (FLD). The method does not distinguish between the amino acid enantiomers.

For determination of free *tryptophan* in *compound feed*, the sample (1 to 5 g) is mixed with 0.1 M hydrochloric acid and an internal standard (alpha-methyltryptophan). The mixture is shaken or stirred for 60 min. After letting particles to settle down, an aliquot is taken and mixed with ortho-phosphoric acid. The resulting solution is adjusted with sodium hydroxide to pH 3. For the determination of total *tryptophan* in *compound feed*, the sample (0.1 to 1.0 g) is hydrolysed under alkaline conditions in an autoclave using a saturated barium hydroxide solution at 110 °C for 20 h. After the hydrolysis, the internal standard (alphamethyltryptophan) and phosphoric acid are added, and the solution is adjusted to pH 3 with hydrochloric acid. The mixtures obtained by applying the two above mentioned procedures are diluted with methanol (with a volume ranging between 10 to 30 % of the total volume) and water, to reach approximately the same concentration of *tryptophan* as in the calibration standard solution. After a filtration step, a chromatographic analysis by HPLC with fluorescence detection (excitation and emission wavelengths at 280 nm and 356 nm, respectively) is performed. The quantification of *tryptophan* is performed by an internal standard calibration [13].

The EN ISO 13904 and EU methods were ring-trial validated for the determination of free and total *tryptophan* in various matrices in the frame of several inter-laboratory comparisons. The performance characteristics reported are shown in Table 1.



Table 1: Method performance characteristics obtained in the frame of four ring-trial validation studies (EN ISO 13904 [12] and EU method [13]) for the determination of free and total *tryptophan* in concentrated products containing *tryptophan* (FA), *premixtures* (PM) and *compound feed* (FS).

Based on the performance characteristics available, the EURL recommends for official control the above mentioned two ring-trial validated methods based on HPLC-FLD to determine *tryptophan* in the *feed additive*, *premixtures* and/or *compound feed*.

Methods of analysis for the determination of the residues of the additive in food (section 2.6.2 of the dossier - Annex II of Commission Regulation (EC) No 429/2008)

An evaluation of corresponding methods of analysis is not relevant for the present application.

Identification/Characterisation of the feed additive (section 2.6.3 of the dossier - Annex II of Commission Regulation (EC) No 429/2008)

For the identification of the *feed additive* the EURL recommends the "L-tryptophan monograph" of the Food Chemical Codex (FCC), where different tests including one based on optical rotation for enantiomer-specific identification are described [14].

Further testing or validation of the methods to be performed through the consortium of National Reference Laboratories as specified by Article 10 (Commission Regulation (EC) No 378/2005, as last amended by Regulation (EU) 2015/1761) is not considered necessary.



4. CONCLUSIONS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

In the frame of this authorisation the EURL recommends for official control (i) the "L-tryptophan" monograph of the Food Chemical Codex (FCC) for the identification of *L-tryptophan* in the *feed additive*; and (ii) two ring-trial validated methods (EN ISO 13904 and EU method) based on high performance liquid chromatography and fluorescence detection (HPLC-FLD) to quantify *tryptophan* in the *feed additive*, *premixtures* and/or *compound feed*.

Note: Only the version of 2016 (and onwards) of the EN ISO 13904 standard method is applicable as older versions do not include the relevant modifications in the standard operational procedure.

In accordance with the requirements of Regulation (EC) No 1831/2003, reference samples of *L-tryptophan produced by fermentation with Escherichia coli* CGMCC 7.460 have been sent to the European Union Reference Laboratory for Feed Additives. The dossier has been made available to the EURL by EFSA.
