TRANSLATING THE WATER, ENERGY, FOOD AND ECOSYSTEM (WEFE) NEXUS APPROACH INTO PRACTICE: TOWARDS A MEDITERRANEAN WEFE NEXUS COMMUNITY OF PRACTICE

OBJECTIVE OF THIS NOTE IS TO SET THE BACKGROUND FOR DISCUSSIONS IN THE BREAKOUT GROUPS

Climate change, demographic development and geopolitical tensions that are already affecting the Mediterranean region may become more severe in the future. The combined effects of desertification, biodiversity loss, water scarcity, groundwater depletion in extensive areas of the region and the rise of extreme weather conditions are likely to put further strain on agricultural, food and energy systems in the Mediterranean. These looming threats call for better coordination of sectoral policies and enhanced regional collaboration in the deployment of WEFE Nexus solutions addressing the specific challenges of the region.

Providing empirical evidence permitting decision makers to weigh up the potential economic and social impacts of different options is essential to balance immediate payoffs with future benefits and encourage changes. Showcasing positive experiences from different places in the Mediterranean region is fundamental. As inspired by the 2021 WEFE Nexus Science Advances Conference, linking the supply of evidence to its demand might be achievable through the interaction of scientists, practitioners, policymakers, investors and other stakeholders coming together as a **Community of Practice (CoP)** at a regional network of demonstration sites.

The Conference organizers have agreed to gather in a core group to articulate the terms of reference for a WEFE Nexus Mediterranean Community of Practice.

Participants in the Breakout Groups are expected to debate on the goals, activities and expected outcomes of such a Community of Practice. This offers the opportunity to empower themselves by participating rather than observing, give feedback at an early stage, internalizing the goals of the CoP and, eventually, promoting the growth of the Community by sharing their expertise. Following up the Conference, organisers and interested stakeholders will further work on the development of the CoP.

Through **networking of selected demonstration sites**, knowledge-sharing and capacity building, the WEFE Nexus Community of Practice will provide a proof-of-concept of the benefits of recommended Nexus measures based on tailored policies, best-available technology and multi-stakeholder partnerships. The CoP, facilitated by a core team of organizations committed to promote the Nexus approach, will engage relevant Mediterranean practitioners and stakeholders, including policy- and decision-makers and investors, to ensure a significant impact. It will take a regional approach, with the ambition to cover as many countries as possible to maximize the exchange of experiences and best practices and to identify solutions that may be broadly applied across the Mediterranean region.

Anticipated objectives are:

• To promote/support the deployment of regional demonstration sites as laboratories for scale-up and policy design

• To contribute to the development, testing, dissemination and replication WEFE Nexus solutions in the Mediterranean region and beyond (**knowledge acquisition**).

The expected outcomes are:

- WEFE Nexus best practices and innovative, science-based solutions for an improved management of natural resources
- Cost-benefits analysis and outlook scenarios on the regional impacts of cross-sectoral Nexus solutions tested at the WEFE Nexus demonstration sites
- New approaches and modes of practices to inform decisions, assist in choosing priorities and incentivising the cross-sectoral management of water, energy, food and ecosystem resources (knowledge packaging)
- Hands-on recommendations for the further development of practicable operational targets (**knowledge transfer**).

ANNEX: OUTLINE OF THE BREAKOUT GROUPS AND GUIDING QUESTIONS

Breakout Groups will be an opportunity for participants to contribute to the forging of the **WEFE Nexus Mediterranean Community of Practice,** the work product of the Conference.
