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## Two points to retain above all others

- The future Common Agricultural Policy (CAP) has great potential to contribute to care for soil
- Will it realise this potential? The next few months may be crucial in answering that question



## So many ways to benefit soil, e.g. ...

- Precision agriculture
- Agro-ecology
- Organic farming
- Crop rotation
- Appropriate soil cover
- Appropriate tillage practices (e.g. in line with contours)
- Agroforestry, other presence of trees

The future CAP can potentially encourage all of these, and more, in various ways...


## Future CAP Strategic Plans and sustainable soil management

- Single CAP plan per MS covering all key elements of CAP together – e.g.
  - conditionality
  - direct payments
  - support for rural development
- Strategic approach based on needs assessment and EU-level objectives
- Structured dialogue with Member States
- CAP plans will be approved by the Commission
- Stronger links to legislation on environment and climate



## Enhanced conditionality

- Improves on current systems of "greening" and "cross-compliance"
- Aims at wider coverage
- Made up of Statutory Management Requirements (SMRs) and standards of Good Agricultural and Environnemental Condition (GAECs)
- New requirements (e.g. new GAEC to protect wetlands and peatlands)
- Improvements to existing requirements





## Future conditionality: GAEC standards

#### Climate change

- GAEC 1: Maintenance of **permanent grassland** based on a ration PG/agricultural area (at national, regional, sub-regional, holding level) ("greening")
- GAEC 2: Protection of **wetland and peatland** (new)
- GAEC 3: Ban on burning arable stubble, except for plant health reasons (cross-compliance)

#### Water

 GAEC 4: Establishment of buffer strips along water courses stubble [minimum width of 3 meters] (cross-compliance)

#### Soil

- GAEC 5: **Tillage management** reducing soil erosion risk with slope consideration (cross-compliance)
- GAEC 6: Minimum soil cover to avoid bare soil in periods that are most sensitive (cross-compliance)
- GAEC 7: Crop rotation in arable land, except for crops growing under water ("greening")

#### Biodiversity and landscapes

- GAEC 8: Minimum share of agricultural area [arable land] devoted to non-productive areas or features, retention LF, ban cutting hedges/trees during bird rearing season
- GAEC 9: Ban on converting or ploughing permanent grassland designated as environmentallysensitive in Natura 2000 sites ("greening")

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## **Eco-schemes**

- New way of using CAP Pillar I funding for dedicated schemes for the environment & climate (plus animal welfare, combating antimicrobial resistance)
- MS must include them in CAP plans (with minimum spending level);
  but voluntary for farmers
- MS have considerable flexibility over content (though broad "areas of action" listed in future regulation)
- Support applies to practices going beyond "baseline" (conditionality + other EU and national legal requirements)
- Payments are annual, but can be based on multi-annual commitments

## CAP Pillar 2 – main environmental elements

## Article 65

Environmental climate and other management commitments

### Article 67

 Area-specific disadvantages resulting from certain mandatory requirements (Natura + WFD payments)

### Other RD interventions

- Advice, training, cooperation, investments
- (both "productive" and "non-productive")



## Next steps for the future CAP

### By end 2021:

- Sign off basic legal acts
- Agree, sign off implementing + delegated acts
- MS <u>formally</u> submit their CAP Strategic Plans (informal discussion already ongoing on informal drafts - partial or full)

#### 2022:

- Formal dialogue between MS and Commission over draft CAP Strategic Plans
- Plans to be approved no later than 6 months after submission

#### 2023:

CAP Strategic Plans "go live" on 1 January
