

26 September European PV conference calls for more interaction between actors

Speakers at the European Photovoltaic Solar Energy Conference and Exhibition (EU PVSEC) held in Amsterdam on 22 - 26 September highlighted the increasingly competitive prices of PV electricity and called for increased collaboration between different policy sectors in the promotion of solar energy.

"The success of solar energy does not only depend on technological innovation, it also requires social and economic inputs. For this reason, I am delighted to see the broad scope of this year's conference, which includes topics such as grid integration, system reliability and policies", said Henk Kamp, Dutch Minister of Economic Affairs, in his introductory speech during the opening session.

24 September Review of available methods for assessing chemical safety promotes alternatives to animal testing

In support of EU legislation on safety of chemicals, the JRC has published a state-of-the art review of test methods and non-testing (computational) approaches that help promote the replacement, reduction, and refinement of animal experiments - known as the 3Rs - in the safety assessment of chemicals. The report "Alternative methods for regulatory toxicology – a state-of-the-art review" focuses on "non-standard" methods, i.e. those that are not included in current regulatory guidelines.

22 September Burnt areas from forest fires halved in 2013

In 2013, forest fires burnt 305 904 hectares in the EU. 95% of this area (291 101 hectares) was located in the five larger EU countries of the Mediterranean region: Portugal, Spain, France, Italy and Greece, with some severe fire events also taking place in northern countries. This figure represents a 34% decrease of the total burnt area when compared to the last 15 years' average but it is also half of the area burnt in 2012, when a particularly active fire season ravaged the EU leaving 607 304 hectares burnt. On average, 460 000 hectares of land burn each year in the European Union with around 90% of the total burnt area located in the Mediterranean region.

19 September A new intelligent path for the visually impaired opens in Germany

A JRC-designed path for the visually impaired was inaugurated today in Melsungen, Germany. The new path will enable a visually impaired person to move around independently in the historical centre of Melsungen using a walking cane, which recognises the signals emitted by microchips placed in the pavement.

The path was inaugurated by the Mayor of Melsungen Marcus Boucsein and Hessian State Secretary Mark Weinmeister, who in his opening speech stressed the importance of the needs of the visually impaired and called for a greater use of communication techniques to respond to those needs. JRC Director Stephan Lechner presented the SESAMONET (Secure and safe mobility network) technology behind the path, which the participants could also test in practice during the inauguration event.

16 September Call for applications - Membership of the Scientific, Technical and Economic Committee for Fisheries (STECF)

The European Commission is to renew the membership of the Scientific, Technical and Economic Committee for Fisheries (STECF). The committee will be composed of scientific experts competent in the area of fisheries and aquaculture management. It aims to advise the Commission on matters pertaining to the conservation and management of living aquatic resources, including biological, economic, environmental, social and technical considerations. Interested candidates are invited to send an application by 15 December 2014.

12 September Quality of production and working conditions top farmers' investment intentions

A JRC study looking into the investment intentions of European farmers in the period 2014-2020 found that 56% of farmers interviewed plan to invest during that period: most of them would rely on their own resources and would target better quality of production and improved working conditions.

These are some of the findings of the study, based on face-to-face interviews. Its sample was limited to six EU countries representing more than half of EU agricultural land: Czech Republic, Germany, Spain, France, Italy and Poland. Although the sample is too limited to predict farm investment across the EU-28, this survey is one of the very few that covers cross-country and cross-farm in this area and provides up-to-date information on investment patterns that is not otherwise available.

10 September Last decade's slow-down in global warming enhanced by an unusual climate anomaly

A hiatus in global warming ongoing since 2001 is due to a combination of a natural cooling phase, known as multidecadal variability (MDV) and a downturn of the secular warming trend. The exact causes of the latter, unique in the entire observational record going back to 1850, are still to be identified, according to a JRC article which analysed the phenomena.

The earth hasn't warmed at the same pace during the 20th century. The noticeable temperature increases during some periods interspersed with fairly stable or decreasing levels during others have been explained as a combination of secular global warming (likely manmade) and natural climate variability. We are currently, in the early 21st century, experiencing a hiatus period, during which surface temperatures have not risen at the same rate as higher atmospheric radiative forcing.

4 September The effect of river nutrients on marine life

A recently published JRC article describes the strong link between the nutrients in European rivers and marine productivity (up to fish production) in the Mediterranean Sea from 1960 to 2012.

The article is the first ever to describe a strong and significant correlation between river nutrient loads and biological production holding over a substantial time period in the Mediterranean Sea. It also provides the first quantitative evidence of the close relationship between chemical conditions, marine productivity and fish abundance in the basin. It postulates that such abundance is due primarily to environmental factors such as nutrient concentration.

2 September Highly skilled may be more important than highly educated in modern economies for social well-being

Being highly proficient in literacy and numeracy may be more important than having a higher level of education when considering the role of these two skills in integration and engagement in the social and economic life of advanced economies.

These are some of the conclusions laid out in a report compiled by the JRC's Centre for Research on Education and Lifelong Learning (CRELL), which analysed the links between formal education, skills among the working age population, as well as different aspects of social well-being, including interpersonal trust, volunteering, health and an individuals' sense of having influence on the political process.
