# COVID-19 media surveillance

Coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19) caused by severe acute respiratory syndrome coronavirus 2 (SARS-CoV-2) is dominating the news, with nearly 90 thousand articles per day on Sunday (in 70 languages, as detected by MEDISYS).

# Headlines

- USA: three top health officials, all members of the administration's coronavirus task force, are self-quarantining as the USA are close to reaching 80,000 deaths
- UK: Prime Minister Johnson unveiled <u>conditional plan to reopen society</u>
- Spain: daily coronavirus-related <u>deaths in Spain fall to 143, the lowest figure since March 18</u>; Spanish government on Friday <u>announced the areas of Spain that will move to the next phase of the government's deescalation plan</u>
- Italy's daily coronavirus death toll and new cases fall with fewest new cases since March
- France reported lowest recent coronavirus toll as some of the lockdown restrictions are lifted today
- Germany: restrictions eased despite climbing infection rate; thousands of protesters gathered in Berlin, Munich, Stuttgart and other German cities to decry isolation measures
- Belgium: over 1.7 million surgical masks distributed in Belgium
- Luxembourg: schools open in phases with half of students starting lessons today
- Poland to announce new election date within two weeks as the number of confirmed cases reaches 15,996
- Russia: WHO sees Russia pandemic stabilizing as total cases hit 200,000
- Ghana: a worker at a fish-processing factory in the Atlantic seafront city of Tema infected 533 other workers
- Iran locks down <u>southwestern county after seeing sharp rise in cases</u>
- India records biggest single-day rise in cases with 4,213 coronavirus cases in 24 hours
- Brazil reached 11,123 deaths and 162,699 confirmed cases rendering Brazil the hardest-hit country in Latin America
- Singapore has confirmed 876 new cases of which 860 were among foreign workers residing in dormitories
- South Korea: anonymous testing is offered after Itaewon, a popular nightlife spot in central Seoul, emerged as a hotbed of infections with 86 confirmed cases
- Japan looks to lift coronavirus emergency in some areas ahead of May 31 deadline
- China: at least six new cases in Wuhan and 11 new asymptomatic cases in Hubei province spark fear of second wave; more cases from regions bordering Russia and North Korea

#### Jacinda Ardern (New Zealand, Prime Minister):

"There is still a chance of silent spread in the future... so today I am announcing that cabinet agrees we are ready to move to level 2, to open up the economy as safely as possible."

#### Jung Eun-kyeong (South Korea, KCDC Director):

"This mass infection has a high chance of turning into community transmission because it was young people who were mainly exposed to the virus this time. They don't exhibit symptoms or only light ones, but they take part in social activities robustly".



### Fact checked: claims by public authorities

 Fact checkers debunk claims that the WHO warned against using masks produced in China and India as they may be contaminated with coronavirus (poligrafo).

#### Fact checked: prevention and treatment

- Fact checkers debunk graphics shared thousands of times on social media claiming to show the exact probability of COVID-19 carriers spreading the disease if they or another person wears a mask, reporting that while experts say that masks do decrease the risk, there is no reliable information on the specific chance of transmission (afp).
- Fact checkers debunk claims that consuming turmeric, lemon and palm oil and drinking coffee cure COVID-19 (thequint, vishvasnews, efe).

#### Fact checked: conspiracy theories

Fact checkers debunk misleading claims from the 26-minute video "Plandemic: The Hidden Agenda Behind Covid-19" spanning from conspiracies about the origin of the coronavirus to falsehoods about wearing a face mask (<u>factcheck.org</u>, <u>politifact</u>).
