

3 March S2E - National Event of Prague - Czech Republic: "The Synergies with Research and Innovation Funds: Stairway to Excellence"

The Czech Republic National Event was co-organised by the S3 Platform - S2E project and the Government Office of the Czech Republic.

3-4 March New Currents in Science: The Challenges of Quality

Open

Each sector of science now has distinct challenges of quality. For scientific research, it is reproducibility; for applicatio consequences; for science advice, acceptability; and for the autonomous 'citizen' and 'DIY' sciences, governance. Th workshop considered current challenges to quality assurance in science and their effects on the trustworthiness of science, as knowledge, in applications and in policy.

4 March Evidence-informed policy-making: What's on the TEN Section's agenda?

Together with the European Economic and Social Committee (EESC), the JRC is organising a series of panel discussions in the framework of the Section for Transport Energy, Infrastructure and the Information Society (TEN Section). The discussions include: energy storage and energy security; decarbonisation of transport- alternative fuels (biofuels, electric vehicles), alternative fuels' infrastructure, CO2 emissions; Digital Transformation of the Economy: Innovation in Education, Digital Skills and Employment implications

7-11 March COSINUS 2016 - COoperation Simulation of NUclear Security

One of the keys in implementing an efficient Nuclear Security programme is the communication between a country's Front Line Officer (FLO) organizations that participate in Nuclear Security detection activities and the Technical Support organization(s) providing scientific services. Since Nuclear Security incidents often involve cross-border movement of nuclear and other radioactive material out of regulatory control, regional and international cooperation should be strengthened. COSINUS is a Simulation Exercise that aims both to promote the exchange of good practices amongst international organizations, and to provide a platform for testing internal (i.e. Front Line Officer- Technical Support) and external (i.e. among countries) communications.

8-10 March <u>Counter Nuclear Smuggling Workshop 2016</u>

In the run-up to the 2016 Nuclear Security Summit, the JRC and the US Department of State (DoS) co-hosted the 2016 Counter Nuclear Smuggling (CNS) Workshop in Karlsruhe, Germany. The workshop focused on the relationship between law enforcement investigations and the technical toolsets that may be applied to support a nuclear smuggling investigation and provide evidence for successful prosecution.

9 March Celebrating 35 years of European Commission — IAEA co-operation on nuclear safeguards

On the 9th of March 2015 a joint reception was held between the European Commission, Hungary and Japan celebrating significant cooperation milestones in nuclear safeguards activity. Since 1981 the Joint Research Centre has provided scientific and technical support to the work of the IAEA. Marking the 35th anniversary of the Commission, Hungary and Japan jointly celebrated this significant achievement.

8-9 March Annual Clearinghouse Meeting

The 2016 Annual Meeting of the European Clearinghouse on Nuclear Power Plant Operating Experience Feedback was held at the premises of the JRC Petten site. The main objective of this meeting was to present and review the recent progress of the project and discuss the work program for 2016.

11 March S2E National Event - Estonia: The Synergies with Research and Innovation Funds: Stairway to Excellence

The Estonia National Event was co-organised by the S3 Platform- Stairway to Excellence and the Estonian Research

13-15 March Arctic Council Workshop on Resilience

As part of this year's Arctic Science Summit Week (12-18 March 2016), IES scientist Julian Wilson participated in the Arctic Council Workshop on Resilience as a nominated member of the workshop steering committee.

14-15 March China-EU Workshop on Water & Air

This joint China-EU Workshop on Water & Air policy provided an opportunity for policy makers, experts and stakeholders to examine the policy challenges and the responses to these major environmental threats, including the legislative frameworks, effective implementation, monitoring and enforcement as well as possible future areas of joint EU-China cooperation. The results of these discussions will help shape and strengthen future cooperation activities between the EU and China. IES scientist Philippe Thunis participated in the workshop as part of a European Commission delegation.

14-16 March Sth Meeting of the International Forum on Life Cycle Assessment Cooperation

5th Meeting of the International Forum on LCA Cooperation was co-organised by the United Nations Environment

Programme (UNEP) and the Brazilian Institute for Information in Science and Technology (IBICT). The first two days were focused on global cooperation around LCA data, with the meeting of the Global Network of Interoperable LCA databases; this Network has the objective to facilitate the access to existing LCA databases for all LCA practitioners and does so by coordinating representatives from governments, academia, database owners, as well as from businesses and industries. The third day of the meeting was targeted at government officials, and focus on experience sharing of implementation of LCA/LCT in policy, and on further defining/strengthening the role of international cooperation in LCA/LCT. IES scientist Simone Fazio was invited by the IBICT and UNEP to participate in this 3-day event.

14-18 March Fifth Working Session of the Intergovernmental Technical Panel on Soils (ITPS)

The Intergovernmental Technical Panel on Soils met for its 5th Working session from 14-18 March 2016 in Rome. The key points that were under discussion during this intense working week include: review and finalization of the first draft of the "Voluntary Guidelines for Sustainable Soil Management"; follow up of the "Status of the World 's Soil Resources" report; follow up on the GSP Plans of Action and the Regional Implementation Plans; report on the collaboration between ITPS and the SPI of UNCCD, IPBES and IPCC; review of the work plan for ITPS 2015-2017; support to the SDG process through soil indicators; preparation of an ITPS publication for 2016, report to the Fourth GSP Plenary Assembly. IES scientist Luca Montanarella is Chair of the IPTS.

14-18 March Air Quality 2016

The 10th International Conference on Air Quality- Science and Application brought together participants from the air quality, climate and health research and user communities to discuss the latest research advances, new applications and highlight important implications for policy and users. In its 20th year, the Conference continues to be the international dissemination hub of air quality research and its applications.

15-16 March

<u>User Workshop of the Copernicus Emergency Management Service - User</u> perspective on the current status & future evolution

The JRC hostined this year's edition of the users' workshop of the Copernicus Emergency Management Service (EMS). The workshop focused on the mapping component and aimed at reviewing the current status of the service and addressing its future evolution.

15-17 March <u>2016 Conference on Big Data from Space (BiDS'16)</u>

Big Data from Space refers to the massive spatio-temporal Earth and Space observation data collected by space-borne and ground-based sensors. This emerging domain is currently facing sharp increase- fortunately paralleled by tremendous amount of new developments and breakthroughs software developments, such as multi-temporal data analysis, data management and information extraction technologies. In addition, the recent multiplication of open access initiatives to Big Data from Space is giving momentum to the field by widening substantially the spectrum of users as well as awareness among the public while offering new opportunities for scientists and value-added companies. The objective of the Big Data from Space conferences was to bring together researchers, engineers and users working in the area of Big Data from Space.

16 March

Workshop on Risk Assessment for Natural-Hazard Impact on Hazardous Chemical Installations

This training workshop gave an overview of the risks of natural-hazard impact on hazardous chemical facilities and provided hands-on training on the JRC's RAPID-N tool for rapid Natech risk assessment and mapping to support decision making. This event was organised in the framework of the JRC Enlargement and Integration Action

16-18 March

9th International Conference Improving Energy Efficiency in Commercial Buildings and Smart Communities (IEECB&SC'16)

The IEECB was jointly organised by Messe Frankfurt and the JRC. The conference took place on 16-18 March 2016 in Frankfurt during Light+Building, the world's leading trade fair for Architecture and Technology. The commercial and public building sector is one of the fastest growing energy consuming sectors. This is mainly due to the growth of commercial and public activities and their associated demand for heating, cooling ventilation (HVAC), ICT services and lighting.
