COVID-19 media surveillance

Coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19) caused by severe acute respiratory syndrome coronavirus 2 (SARS-CoV-2) is dominating the news, with over 120 thousand articles per day on Sunday (in 70 languages, as detected by MEDISYS).

Headlines

- USA: more than 140,000 cases; USA could face 200,000 deaths and millions of cases according to NIAID director Fauci; social distancing extended through end of April
- Italy: 97,689 cases and 10,779 deaths in total reported on 29 March 18:00;
 Albania sent 30 doctors and nurses
- Spain: deaths continue to rise with 838 deaths reported on Sunday; lockdown extended to include all non-essential workers
- France: patients from eastern France transferred by TGV to Bordeaux and by plane to Ulm
- Cases in the vicinity of EU institutions: 1,702 new cases confirmed, 78 new deaths in Belgium; nearly 2000 cases and 21 deaths in total in Luxembourg
- Poland: debate about presidential election on 10 May
- Hungary: debate about new law to protect against coronavirus
- UK: restrictions could last six months according to chief medical officer
- Russia: Moscow went into mandatory lockdown with 1,000 cases reported
- India: lockdown triggers exodus to rural areas as Prime Minister Modi defends the measures asking for forgiveness
- Brazil: 4,256 cases and 136 deaths reported; President Bolsonaro is considering a regulation to allow citizens to return to work
- Nigeria: <u>lockdown in Lagos and the capital city of Abuja</u>
- South Korea: decrease in number of new cases, but clusters and imported cases remain a concern
- Japan: travelers from the US, China, South Korea and most of Europe banned from entry; stocks fell due to fears of Tokyo lockdown; 2,578 confirmed cases, including 712 from cruise ship Diamond Princess, with 64 deaths
- China: drop in new coronavirus cases with no transmission in Wuhan for sixth day; return to normalcy while maintaining the status
- Economy: Remarks by Dutch Finance Minister Hoekstra made headlines; oil prices fall to 17-year low

Fact checked: fear mongering

- Italy did not "surrender" to the coronavirus outbreak (boomlive).
- Photos of people covered in blankets sitting on the roadside are not from coronavirus-hit Italy, but from earthquake-hit Croatia (thequint).
- Italy's Internet infrastructure is not about to collapse (pagellapolitica).

Fact checked: prevention and treatment

- Drinking tea and eating bananas cannot prevent COVID-19 (animalpolitico, boomlive).
- Miracle Mineral Solution (MMS) or sodium chlorite does not cure COVID-19 (maldita.es).
- A Cuban drug has not cured over 1,500 coronavirus patients (efectococuyo).
- It is not true that a COVID-19 vaccine that can cure patients in under 3 hours has been created (thequint).

Fact checked: conspiracy theories

• The novel coronavirus is not a bioweapon (<u>efectococuyo</u>).
