

### 30 November JRC at COP21: Supporting the EU to get a fair and ambitious climate deal

One of the Commission's top priorities for 2015 is to secure a fair, ambitious and legally binding global climate deal at the United Nations Climate Change Conference in Paris (COP21), which starts today.

# 30 NovemberJRC develops methods for measuring bisphenol A and its replacing substances in<br/>food

Scientists from the JRC developed fit-for-purpose analytical methods for the determination of bisphenol A and 12 similar substances (analogues) in food matrices to support possible future monitoring studies.

### 27 November <u>Extreme heatwaves may hit Europe in the short term</u>

Regional climate projections for the two coming decades (2021-2040) suggest enhanced probability of heatwaves anywhere in Europe, which would be comparable or greater than the Russian heatwave in 2010 - the worst since 1950.

### 26 November DNA sequences in GMOs: largest database now publicly available

The JRC has published a new database, JRC GMO-Amplicons, which contains more than 240 000 DNA sequences appearing in genetically modified organisms (GMOs). It will help to verify the presence of GMOs in food, feed and environment.

### 25 November <u>New tools for learning from accidents</u>

New tools for accident investigators and trainers have been developed by the European Safety, Reliability & Data Association (ESReDA), of which the JRC is member. The tools include a model to analyse what has been learned and what has not, a list of barriers that prevent learning, and guidelines on accident investigation training. It is important to learn from accidents in order to prevent similar ones from reoccurring. One of the elements of a successful organisation is the ability to learn from both success and failure, and the ability to learn from others.

#### 25 November <u>Global growth in CO2 emissions stagnates</u>

After a decade of rapid growth in global  $CO_2$  emissions, which increased at an average annual rate of 4%, much smaller increases were registered in 2012 (0.8%), 2013 (1.5%) and 2014 (0.5%).

### 23 November <u>Soil security – a call to arms</u>

In a Comment published in Nature today, JRC scientist Luca Montanarella calls for a voluntary international agreement to protect soil from erosion and degradation through a reinvigorated Global Soil Partnership.

### 23 November Improved weather conditions for winter crops

The latest MARS crop monitoring bulletin finds that growing conditions have been good for recently sown and emerging winter crops, thanks to above-average temperatures in most European agricultural regions from late October to mid-November.

### 23 November JRC-IRMM develops and releases new GMO certified reference materials

The JRC released a new GMO (genetically modified organism) certified reference material (CRM) to be used by GMO testing laboratories to analyse the GMO maize VCO-Ø1981-5 product in food and feeding stuff.

## 20 November Sharing knowledge on R&I will boost the potential of the blue economy in the Mediterranean

This week's declaration of the Union for the Mediterranean (UfM), a partnership of EU28, the European Commission and 15 Mediterranean countries, focused on closer cooperation to promote growth, jobs and investments deriving from the marine and maritime sectors.

### 19 November JRC-IRMM released its first reference material certified for radioactivity in a food matrix: IRMM-426

JRC-IRMM developed and released the first fruit matrix reference material (IRMM-426 Wild Berries) certified for the two most important anthropogenic (man-made) radionuclides, 137Cs and 90Sr, and for the natural 40K. This reference material supports the precise measurement of radionuclides in agricultural products.

18 November Uganda - JRC's early flood warning system triggers pre-disaster hur action	<u>manitarian</u>

To prevent waterborne diseases (e.g. dysentery) brought on by floods, the Red Cross last week distributed preparedness items to households in flood-prone villages 300 km north-east of Uganda's capital, Kampala.

### 18 November Enhancing stakeholder collaboration to boost regional growth

The JRC and the European Commission's Directorate-General for Regional and Urban Policy have supported Greek authorities in order to help entrepreneurs and authorities to find out in which areas they should prioritise and further specialise if they want to strengthen their competitive advantage.

## 18 NovemberPreparation and sublimation of uranium tetrafluoride for the production of thin<br/>235UF4 targets

Scientists of the JRC-Institute for Reference Materials and Measurements (IRMM) determined the yields of a wet chemical precipitation method, applied for the conversion of triuranium octoxide (U308) into uranium tetrafluoride (UF4).

### 18 November <u>E-TRACK officially launched</u>

The 'Energy - Transparency Centre of Knowledge' (E-TRACK) is a joint initiative agreed between the Directorate General for Energy and the JRC for the promotion of public participation in the implementation of energy policies.

#### 17 November <u>A global approach towards alternatives to animal testing</u>

Members of the International Cooperation on Alternative Test Methods attended a two-day meeting hosted by the European Union Reference Laboratory for Alternatives to Animal Testing (EURL ECVAM).

### 17 November Launch of the EMEG website

Today marks the launch of the European Microbiology Expert Group (EMEG) website, which provides information on the implementation of alternative methods for testing the microbiological drinking water quality under the EU Drinking Water Directive (Council Directive 98/83/EC of 3 November 1998 on the quality of water intended for human consumption).

According to the Drinking Water Directive, EU Member States can use alternative methods for testing the microbial quality of drinking water.

17 November <u>Measurement of the half-life of the nuclear waste product samarium-151</u>

In close collaboration with scientists from various European laboratories, JRC scientists produced better decay data of the long-lived radionuclide samarium(Sm)-151. This work contributes to an improved radiological characterisation of nuclear waste.

### 16 November Monitoring CO2 emissions from space

A recent DG for Internal Market, Industry, Entrepreneurship and SMEs - JRC expert report proposes a strategy for the establishment of a European observation system dedicated to monitoring CO2 emissions from space.

### 16 November <u>The effects of global warming on regional marine productivity</u>

A recently published JRC article describes the effects of atmospheric forcing changes on the Mediterranean Sea's primary productivity rate over the coming century. It finds that, although the average overall primary production rate will be almost unchanged, climate change will lead to a reduction in primary production in the western basin, and an increase in the eastern basin.

### 16 November Effects of 25 years of regional weather variability on crop yields in France

France is the EU's largest producer of wheat and maize, and has collected a unique high-quality statistical dataset on crop yields at département level for over 25 years. The presence of different climatic regions makes France an ideal test-case to investigate the role of climate variability on crop yields and to better understand the impacts of future climate change.

# 16 November JRC researchers improve the methodology for the analysis of cross section measurements at a cold neutron beam

In close collaboration with international nuclear research organisations, scientists from the JRC described a method to improve the analysis of cross section measurements at a cold neutron beam. This work is part of the JRC contribution to improve the accuracy of nuclear data, which are important for the development of innovative reactor systems.

#### 13 November Detecting silver nanoparticles in consumer products

Detecting the presence of nanoparticles in consumer products is an enduring challenge for analytical laboratories. Although many different techniques can potentially be used to measure the dimension of objects smaller than a 1/10000 of a millimetre, in practice, the results obtained using different methods may not always prove to be consistent.

#### 13 November Invasive freshwater species in Europe's lakes and rivers: how do they come in?

A JRC-led article has identified escape from aquaculture facilities, releases in the wild due to pet/aquarium trade and stocking activities as the main pathways of alien species introduction in European lakes and rivers.

#### 13 November Monitoring radionuclides in food in the European Union

JRC scientists have compiled and published an overview of the legislation and practical modalities for the implementation of radionuclide monitoring in foodstuff in the European Union. The overview also provides an outline of the monitoring programmes instituted by the Member States and stresses the importance of the quality of data.

### 12 November Impact of low-energy photons on prompt fission gamma ray characteristics

Scientists from JRC standardised, in collaboration with Swedish researchers, developed a method to measure and analyse prompt  $\gamma$ -ray data emitted in nuclear fission. This is an important step to improve evaluated nuclear data files needed worldwide for precise nuclear heat calculations relevant for future sustainable and essentially CO2-free energy production.

#### 11 November Dialogues on Food: Walking in Expo imagining the future of food in 2040

Awareness, self-sustainability, wellbeing, quality, coexistence, convergence, responsibility, resilience, these are some of the key words that emerged from the 10 scenarios elaborated by 90 citizens who participated at a joint JRC and CNR project called Food Futuring Tours.

#### 11 November Forests absorb 9% of greenhouse gas emissions in Europe

Over the past decade, European forests have absorbed about 9% of the net greenhouse gas emissions in the pan-European region (46 countries). Having expanded over the past 25 years, forests now cover 33% (215 million ha) of Europe's area. In economic terms, the forest sector is on a steady path of recovery, according to a new report coauthored by the JRC.

# 11 NovemberFirst consistent determination of the hydrogen content for the neutron fluence<br/>reference

Scientists from the JRC-Institute for Reference Materials and Measurements prepared tristearin (C57H11006) layers with an areal density up to 10 mg/cm2 on tantalum backings by physical vapour deposition (PVD) and determined for the first time the hydrogen content of the initial powder, the evaporated material and the residue in the crucible by combustion analysis. It was demonstrated convincingly that the hydrogen content remains unchanged under thermal treatment.

**10 November**In close collaboration with a research group from the Australian National Measurement Institute in Pymble, JRC scientists have improved the measurement of nucleic acids by using a JRC certified reference material. This is important for digital polymerase chain reaction (dPCR) instrument developers.

# 9 November JRC at the World Science Forum – focus on science in policy making, resilience and science for river basins

The 7th edition of the biennial World Science Forum (WSF) took place on 4-7 November 2015 in Budapest. Its main theme, The Enabling Power of Science, invited to reflect on the way how science opens new paths for the improvement of human life, business innovation and policy making.

### 9 November Boar Taint – Measuring the thresholds for consumer acceptance

In close collaboration with a research group from the German University of Göttingen, the JRC investigated the consumer liking of boar meat. Therefore, the JRC developed and validated an analytical method that can serve as a reference for future rapid tests to define the sensory thresholds for boar taint acceptance.

### 6 November <u>Tsunami early warning: JRC tests new low-cost device to measure sea level</u>

A new, low-cost experimental device for sea level measurement has been developed by JRC scientists. The first four devices have been installed in Spain and Portugal.

### 4 November <u>Analytical method for precise measurements of biodiesel components</u>

Scientists from the JRC-Institute for Reference Materials and Measurements (IRMM) developed and validated a new method for the determination of selected fatty acid methyl esters (FAMEs) or transesterification products in diesel. This method can serve as a reference, for example to solve disputes between control laboratories and to develop future certified reference materials.

### 3 November <u>Reliability of cardiac troponin assays for diagnosis of mycocardial infarction</u>

In close collaboration with the Troponin I Working Group of the International Federation of Clinical Chemistry and Laboratory Medicine (IFCC) a JRC scientist evaluated the standardisation capability of cardiac troponin I assays currently on the market in an IFCC pilot project. The study confirmed that there is a lack of standardisation in troponin I measurements. As simulated by mathematical re-calibration the use of a suitable reference material for the calibration of currently applied cardiac troponin I assays is essential to achieve equivalent results and is expected to lead to clinically much more acceptable assay performances.

#### 2 November

### <u>Improved decay data of thorium-227 – Providing confidence for application in</u> <u>nuclear medicine and radiation protection</u>

In close collaboration with researchers from the UK National Physical Laboratory (NPL), scientists from the JRC-IRMM investigated the half-life of thorium-227, for the first time by direct observation of the change in activity with time using a high-purity germanium (HPGe) gamma-ray spectrometer.
