


- Loneliness has consequences for individual well-being and when many are concerned, for the society as a whole
- Loneliness can also directly affect societal cohesion when it leads to:
 - Reduced interpersonal trust
 - Higher risk taking behaviours
 - Political disengagement
- Stigmatization can affect social engagement of the lonely
- The EU Loneliness Survey allows for exploring these relationships





Lonely respondents are on average less likely to trust others




"In general how much do you trust most people?"








Altruism and volunteering

$\blacksquare Lonely \qquad \blacksquare Not Lonely$






Risk taking behaviour

"Are you more of a risk-taking person or do you try to avoid risks when it concerns each of the following areas"







"To what extent do you agree with the following statement? 'People like me don't have any say about what the government




"To what extent do you agree with the following statement? 'People like me don't have any say about what the government

"In general, do you think that [...]:

- People who feel lonely mostly have themselves to blame for their loneliness;
- Feeling lonely is mostly due to factors and circumstances beyond a person's control;
- ✓Both equally;
- ✓ Don't know"



Relevance and future research

- Lonely individuals differ from non lonely ones in their behaviours and attitudes
- They are more likely to engage in risky behaviours, to feel more politically disengaged and to have lower trust
- This could have consequences on societal cohesion More research is needed
- Social isolation of lonely individuals may be reinforced by **stigma** towards the lonely
