

Open The EU is recruiting researchers - Call for expressions of interest

24 August Quality standards of breast cancer services differ across Europe

A JRC survey on the use of ISO standards in breast cancer care services in Europe finds that in 76% of the countries examined at least one healthcare organisation is accredited or holds an accredited certificate of conformity to the respective standard.

20 August Europe hit by one of the worst droughts since 2003

Much of the European continent has been affected by severe drought in June and July 2015, one of the worst since the drought and heat wave of summer of 2003.

18 August Foresight food security: from hunger and poverty to food system approach

Food security policy should be moving towards a much broader landscape and focusing on regular access to food, while addressing food insecurity for a fraction of communities.

12 August Average EU consumer wastes 16% of food; most of which could be avoided

A new study analysing available statistics on consumer food waste has estimated that Europeans waste an average of 123 kg per capita annually, or 16% of all food reaching consumers.

11 August Sun tourism in 2100: climate change to lower revenues in Mediterranean regions

Climate change could affect tourism demand in EU regions as altered climatic conditions may influence the relative allure of many regions.

7 August The 9th edition of the Karlsruhe Nuclide Chart is out

The JRC, together with Nucleonica GmbH, has released a new edition of the Karlsruhe Nuclide Chart, an extended periodic table which displays all known isotopes of every element and their radioactive data.

6 August Increased use of renewables results in growing GHG emission savings in the EU

Greenhouse gasses (GHG) emission savings due to final renewable energy consumption in electricity, cooling/heating and transport sectors rose at a compound annual growth rate of 8.8% from 2009 to 2012, confirming renewables' great potential in climate change mitigation.

4 August Global Forest Trade Model to assess the development of the forest-based sector

A newly designed economic equilibrium model based on international trade will help policymakers to examine the impact of policy options on the economic development of the forest-based industry.

31 July <u>First Watch List for emerging water pollutants</u>

A JRC report short-lists seven potential aquatic pollutants to complete a first Watch List which will provide high-quality information on the concentrations of emerging or little-known pollutants across the EU.

29 July Satellite imagery analysis quantifies heavy vegetation losses in Brazilian drylands

Over two decades, agricultural expansion and neglect have reduced natural vegetation cover in the Brazilian eco-regions Cerrado and Caatinga to 47% and 63% of the original area respectively, according to a study led by the JRC.

24 July <u>Science helps to reduce flood risk around the world</u>

New computer models that estimate the social and economic impacts of flooding help to protect communities from devastating floods and to reduce the economic losses associated with them.

23 July <u>Wind energy provides 8% of Europe's electricity</u>

EU's grid connected cumulative capacity in 2014 reached 129 GW, meeting 8% of European electricity demand, equivalent to the combined annual consumption of Belgium, the Netherlands, Greece and Ireland. According to a JRC report, the impressive growth of the industry will allow at least 12% electricity share by 2020, a significant contribution to the goal of the European energy and climate package of 20% share of energy from renewable sources.

22 July ICT innovation: SMEs make best use of EU research funding

Innovation Radar survey finds that small and medium enterprises (SMEs) are champions of EU research programmes.

15 July Towards better scientific evidence and support for policy-making on sustainable development

On 15 July, the European Commission organised a side event to the Third International Conference on Financing for Development, taking place in Addis Ababa, Ethiopia.

14 July New strategy to track how chemicals behave in the human body

The JRC-run EU Reference Laboratory for Alternatives to Animal Testing (EURL ECVAM) has just published its strategy to promote ways of integrating data obtained through non-animal tests with computer models of the human body.

10 July Options for the review of the EC nanomaterial definition published

The JRC has published science-based options to improve the clarity and the practical application of the EC recommendation on the definition of a nanomaterial.

9 July Cooperation with UCAR on atmospheric and climate change research

On 9 July, during an official trip to the US, Vladimir Šucha, Director-General of the JRC and Professor Antonio Bussalacchi, representing the University Corporation for Atmospheric Research (UCAR) signed a new research arrangement.

7 July <u>Tundra study uncovers impact of climate warming in the Arctic</u>

The JRC has contributed to "Climate sensitivity of shrub growth across the tundra biome", the biggest study to date of tundra shrub growth.

7 July <u>Science supporting climate change negotiations</u>

On 7 July, the international scientific conference "Our Common Future under Climate Change" - the largest scientific forum ahead of the 21st session of the Conference of the Parties (COP 21) to the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC) - starts in Paris.

6 July New project tests sharing of radio spectrum for mobile broadband

The JRC has started a pilot project in collaboration with the Italian Ministry for Economic Development to test the sharing of radio spectrum.

3 July <u>Database of digital services for carers of the elderly launched</u>

The JRC partnered with EUROCARERS to launch a new online database of digital services for carers of older people to assist carers in fulfilling their activities.

3 July Winners of young scientists' competitions visit the JRC

Six winners of the German "Jugend forscht" competition and two of the European Contest for the Young Scientists (EUCYS) joined the project which gave the two groups the opportunity to meet and discuss their works collectively.

1 July European Nanomedicine Characterisation Laboratory is born

On 1 July, the European Nano-Characterisation Laboratory funded by the European Union's Horizon 2020 research and innovation programme was launched.
