

3 February Composite Indicators and Scoreboards: Sharing Best Practices

The purpose of this half day event was to bring together policy analysts and researchers from the European Commission, international organisations, think tanks and the academia, to foster a practical exchange of experiences across a wide range of key policy areas that are monitored through composite indicators and scoreboards. During the event the Competence Centre on Composite Indicators and Scoreboards (COIN) was launched.

3-4 February Protection of CBRN facilities: EU and Serbia share best practices on their CBRN Action Plans

The workshop aimed at facilitating EU CBRN experts and the Serbian CBRN national team to share best practices, views and methodologies on actions identified within their respective CBRN Action Plans with a focus on the protection of CBRN facilities against natural disasters.

4 February <u>66. Öffentliche Hochschultagung</u>

IES scientist L. Montanarella was an invited keynote speaker at the opening of the conference, at which he spoke on "EU-Agrarpolitik aus Sicht der Welternährungssicherung und Ressourcenschonung".

4 February The Role of City-Regions in the Achievement of a Low-Carbon Economy

The COST Association and the European Commission's Joint Research Centre (JRC) hosted a Joint Workshop which aimed at revisiting the importance of both bottom-up and top-down solutions in accelerating the penetration of low carbon policies into practice.

9-10 February <u>European Alien Species Information Network: enlargement and training</u>

Invasive alien species (IAS) - i.e. species that are not native to Europe and have a severe negative impact on native flora and fauna - are one of the main pressures on biodiversity in the EU and at global level. The workshop focused on the expansion of EASIN, especially by including offline databases that exist in institutes or national repositories which are not accessible to the scientific community. The workshop addressed data standardisation issues and protocols for sharing information.

7-12 February 11th International Symposium on Ecohydraulics

Ecohydraulics is central to many challenges facing river and water resource management around the world. It links the disciplines of hydraulics with aquatic ecology, water engineering, fluvial geomorphology and biogeochemistry. The International Symposium on Ecohydraulics is the premier international meeting for scientists and innovative practitioners working across these disciplines focussing on the underpinning science and its application.

15-17 February Modern Spectrum Management - Experience with License Shared Access

The radio spectrum policy programme is a cornerstone for Digital Europe— to promote innovation, growth and competitiveness by creating a Digital Single Market in the EU. With the growing demand for broadband wireless services today and for the development of 5G technologies for the societal needs beyond 2020, new policy orientations and innovative approaches are needed to spectrum management and its efficient use.

22 February <u>Behavioural Insights Applied to Policy: European Report 2016 (BIAP 2016)</u>

There is growing recognition that behavioural insights (BIs)—by shedding light on how people actually make choices—help deliver more effective policies and complement traditional forms of intervention. BIAP 2016 covers 32 European Countries (EU + EFTA) and presents a wealth of policy interventions either implicitly or explicitly informed by BIs. It also reviews institutional developments and puts forward a comparative framework (PRECIS) describing national teams applying BIs to policy-making. BIAP 2016 comes at an important point in time. The European Commission (EC) has been a front-runner in bringing BIs into legislation and regulatory intervention. In the coming years, BIs will certainly have a broader role in supporting the EC's Better Regulation Agenda. Commissioner Navracsics opened the event and Prof. Madrian (Harvard Kennedy School) delivered a speech about the added value of linking academic research to policy-making. The event gathered mainly policy-makers from European Institutions and from around 26 national governments in Europe. A few NGOs, businesses, think tanks, researchers and journalists also attended. The purpose is to share knowledge on how BIs are being applied to diverse policy fields, promote links among the different actors, and inspire new applications of BIs to policy.

23 February European Science and Technology Network on Unconventional Hydrocarbons Extraction - Annual Conference

The Network on European Science and Technology on Unconventional Hydrocarbons Extraction organised its Annual conference in Brussels.

23-25 February <u>International Conference on Ocean Energy</u>

The ICOE 2016 was organised and hosted by Renewable UK. The JRC was present at the exhibition with a stand at booth 72, promoting the SET-Plan and JRC work on ocean renewable energy. JRC colleagues were also involved as speakers and chair persons in the conference, which was opened by Commissioner Vella.

25-26 February Public Participation and Transparency in the Implementation of Energy Policies

The workshop is part of the JRC activities on collecting and sharing diverse practices for public participation and developing a knowledge centre for transparency governance, in particular for The 'Energy- Transparency Centre of Knowledge' (E-TRACK). E-TRACK is a joint initiative agreed between the Directorate-General for Energy (DG ENER) and the Joint Research Centre (JRC) of the European Commission (EC) for the promotion and enhancement of public participation in the implementation of energy policies. The objective of E-TRACK is to become a central point of reference for monitoring, disseminating and sharing information on good practices of public participation in energy policy implementation across the EU.
